The Rock River Office held a fun CSI TV show-themed awareness dinner.

Through events like these, the agency battled Alzheimer's disease by educating, building awareness, and raising funds to support programs and research.

How we supported the community

In 2007, the Alzheimer's Association, Central Illinois Chapter served 6,360 people in our 20-county area through family caregiver and healthcare professional education programs, Safe Return, 24-7 Helpline, civic talks and health fairs.

In 2007 we ...

Provided early-stage Alzheimer's programs across 20 counties, preparing caregivers and person of care for lifestyle changes due to memory loss, including communication, safety, behavior and legal/financial issues.

Presented middle-stage programs to prepare caregivers for difficult behavior and communication challenges as Alzheimer's progresses.

Facilitated and sponsored three Family Night programs (one in each location) with over 260 family members attending. Family Caregiver Nights featured nationally known speakers on topics such as connecting, communicating, and creating moments of joy with patients.

Held legal and financial forums at our three locations with experts who answered family questions and provided general information on power of attorney, guardianship, estate planning and fraud.

Enrolled 144 individuals in the Safe Return program, raising the total to 1,019 in 2007.

Sponsored 39 ongoing monthly support groups throughout our 20 counties.

Helped more than 1,227 families through our 24-7 Helpline information and referral service.

Reached 1,953 people through civic talks and health fairs.

Presented three eight-hour Illinois Department of Public Health Train the Trainer programs for 71 healthcare professionals such as nurses, social workers, nursing home administrators, therapists, counselors and others.

Trained activity therapists through Activity Based Alzheimer's Care programs, focusing on issues such as enhancing social connections and building a sense of purpose in individuals with Alzheimer's.

Improved care by training 380 professionals during 16 on-site programs and presented seven training sessions for 157 individuals studying to be certified nurse assistants.

Trained 73 professionals in the State of Illinois-supported Best Friends program that shows how to give care like a good, caring friend.

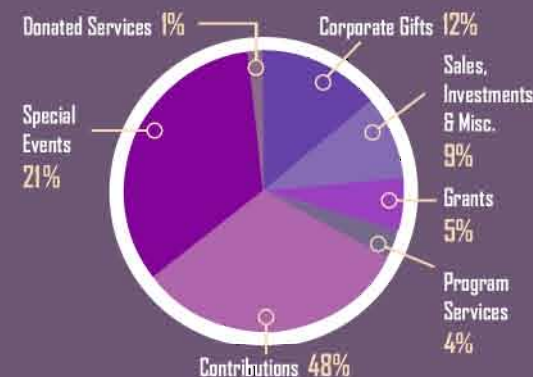
